

David Brancaccio is host and senior editor of American Public Media's *Marketplace Morning Report*, the business program with the largest audience in any medium. His *Economy 4.0* series on *Marketplace* focused on ways to make the economy better serve more people. He anchored the award-winning public television news program *NOW on PBS* until 2010. His reporting has focused on the future of the economy, regulation of financial markets, the role of technology in labor markets, human rights, the environment, and social enterprises.

David's work has earned some of the highest honors in broadcast journalism, including the Peabody, the Columbia-duPont, the Emmy, and the Walter Cronkite awards. His feature-length documentary film about economic alternatives entitled *Fixing the Future* was released in theaters nationwide in 2012 and is now available from Netflix, iTunes, and on-demand cable television.

He is author of a book about Americans applying their personal values to their money, entitled *Squandering Aimlessly*.
